Rich in Christ

"Sing to the Lord of harvest, Sing songs of love and praise (*LSB* 893.1). The time of harvest has come, and we rejoice in the fruits of God's creation. David writes in Psalm 64, "You crown the year with your bounty; your wagon tracks overflow with abundance" (11). As we join the hymnwriter "With joyful hearts and voices Your alleluias raise" (ibid) we do well to stop and reflect on the Gospel reading from the first Sunday in August – the rich man and his barns.


Jesus introduced the parable with a warning concerning the 9th and 10th commandments. "*Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions*" (Luke 12:15). All the bounty we receive and enjoy comes from God but that is not the sum of our lives. There remains something greater. The rich man harvested a bumper crop yet remained bankrupt toward God.

As we rejoice in this harvest season, we have even more reason to rejoice in the spiritual gifts we receive — pardon and peace, life and salvation in Christ. Pardon by the redemption from sins accomplished for us on the cross. Isaiah prophesied, "Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins" (Isaiah 40:2). That double portion Christ paid on our behalf; your sentence of eternal death – commuted. YOU ARE PARDONNED.

And being pardoned, we are at peace as Paul writes to the church at Philippi, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice... And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:4, 7). It is a peace that the world cannot take away.

Pardon and peace, in turn, result in life and salvation in union with Christ. In both Romans and Colossians Paul uses the language of union. From Colossians two, "having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead" (12). YOU ARE MINE God declares in baptism and with Christ, YOU WILL RISE at the last.

You and I will be part of God's eternal harvest about which Jesus spoke to his disciples beside Jacob's well. "Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest" (John 4:35). White for harvest— part of the mission of the LWML includes equipping workers for that harvest with our mites and mission grants. But, even closer to home, it includes speaking that word of pardon and peace paid for by Jesus' death and resurrection in our homes, in our communities, and wherever we may go that all people may have life and salvation.

Does your church group have bylaws? They are required for membership with Lutheran Women in Mission. Bylaws will hold your group together. They establish your purpose, describe membership, and define your officers' roles.



Every two years review your bylaws. Group activities can change. Officer roles may change. New issues may arise. Please inform the Oregon District Structure Committee when you start to review your bylaws and send the revisions to *ckroemer@stjohnmac.org* before your group votes. The committee will confirm that your bylaws are in line with LWML's bylaws. After the committee's review, your group will be ready to vote to accept the revisions. Once accepted, send the approved bylaws to *ckroemer@stjohnmac.org*.

Be sure to involve the members of your group. Include them in the review process and be sure the reviewed and revised bylaws are presented to the group for a final vote of approval.

Like cups, rubber bands, and burger buns, up-to-date bylaws will support your group, hold it tight together, and keep it from falling apart
