

Taking the Gospel to B.C. North, \$6500

Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots (LAMP) Ministry Inc. is committed to recruiting, training, supporting, and sending volunteer missionaries to teach Scripture and proclaim the Gospel in remote northern communities. This project will enable LAMP Ministry to recruit, train and send many more volunteer missionaries to teach Indigenous children in northern Canada about the love of Jesus. These children likely will not have any source of personal organized Christian education or witness to the Gospel. The rate of youth suicide is over 15% as youth take their own lives out of despair and hopelessness. LAMP offers hope and healing to save these children from a senseless death.

Here, Dr. Jane, a resident native, Grade 2 educator in the village of the First Nation people, one of three the farthest north villages, Old Hazelton, teaches the native language, "Gitsanimx" at **Monday NightSchool**, to a H.S. volunteer team from Christ the Vine, Damascus, Or. They are there for a week of VBS, just learning "simple words," so the Team may speak to the little children. *Nathan Schmidt* joins them on a google skype program, from home in Oregon, determined to learn this difficult dialect.
