




DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME?

Life in Easter

I am writing this just after we, the church, celebrated the Fifth Sunday in Lent; the last of the Sundays "in" not "of" Lent. Here at Redeemer we sang *Sing Praise to God, the Highest Good*, a joyful, if a little subdued hymn in keeping with the idea that even during the penitential season, every Sunday is a little Easter. The sermon asked the question, "What is life in Lent?" And we found the answer in Paul's letter to the Romans. *we ... walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit* (Romans 8:4).

But now we walk on the other side of Easter, in the shadow of the cross and the full sun of the empty tomb. I pray that yours was a joyous, even glorious celebration as we once again listened to the angel. "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay" (Matthew 28:5-6). As we gathered with the full congregation, even the visitors, especially the visitors. As we enjoyed Easter breakfast amid smiles and cheerful greetings and perhaps even a new hat!

But joy can be short-lived and will likely fade away with time and so I ask you to return to that pre-Easter sermon theme and ask; "What is life in Easter?" We relish and rejoice in the full-blown joy of the day, even the week of Easter. (We actually have lectionary readings assigned for Easter Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday.) And then the readings run out and life returns; the day-to-day living in the time between Christ's first coming and his second.

And again, we walk. Paul to the Galatian Christians suggests, *If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit"* (Galatians 5:25). We walk with the Spirit who ushered us into the faith in baptism. Who continues to feed us with the Word. Who delivers the absolution – YOU ARE FORGIVEN. And here we find the precious key to life in Easter; forgiven means forgiving.

We pray as much in the fifth petition. "And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Sometimes it seems hard to do ... but that is only when we are looking outwards; when we are looking at the person who offended us. But stop, look inward, and contemplate the blackness of your own heart, try to measure the magnitude of forgiveness already given to you in Christ by the Spirit.

Forgiven and forgiving ... life in Easter revolves around the gift given and regifted to others. Life in Easter is not counting the sins against us but burying them in the open tomb. "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32). Amen.

LBS 537

But also, the tiniest insect, the molecules of the atmosphere and the growing knowledge that we need to take care of all of God's world. Our stewardship is important. 

(Deborah's Story: Judges 4, 5)

In the Word



"You want me to do what?" could have been Deborah's response when Barak, commander of the army, stated, "If you will go with me [into battle], I will go, but if you will not go with me, I will not go" (Judges 4:8b). After all, it was Barak, not Deborah, God told to go into battle! Deborah had many reasons not to go with Barak. She was a judge; she was needed by the people. She wasn't a warrior; women didn't go to war. She was a wife; her household came first. But she used none of these as excuses. She went with the troops, encouraging them, and God gave them victory over the enemy.

God chose Deborah to support Barak and his troops. God also gives us opportunities to support and encourage others. It may be in a card, a letter, or a phone call. It may be at a food bank or at a health center. It may be praying with someone. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works ... encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near (Hebrews 10:24, 25b).
